The "I Don't Want To Fry Chicken" Recipe

Gather the following ingredients:

- 4 boneless, skinless chicken breasts
- Olive oil
- Dry ranch dressing
- Non-stick pan



Put enough olive oil in a non-stick pan to coat it. Turn the stove on medium. Put the dry ranch dressing on a plate and lightly coat both sides of the breasts with it. Immediately put the breasts one at a time in the pan until all four are in the pan. Do not turn the breasts until you are sure the first side is done. Turn with tongs—do not use a fork as it will cause juices to drain out and chicken will be dry. Chicken will be golden brown when done. Gravy can be made from the pan "stickins."

For a change, squeeze lemon or lime juice on breasts and let sit in the refrigerator for about ten minutes in a covered bowl or plastic bag. Sprinkle breasts lightly with curry powder and follow instructions above.

Serve with a salad and a starch (buttered rice, baked potato, rice or your favorite.) Serves four.

Bowling Rumors Were Flying in Vegas

The bowling rumors were flying during the NABI Tournament at The Orleans and if true good things await bowlers and bowling groups headed for Las Vegas. The local Las Vegas writers and TV announcers were talking about how business was down in Las Vegas, just like it in most parts of the country. A slow economy could result in better room deals for bowlers headed to Las Vegas in the next 12 months. But that was not the most fascinating rumor making the rounds.

The big one, which has not been confirmed, would center on the USBC Open Championship at the Cashman Center. Everyone knows that team entries are flowing in for the 2009 USBC Open Championship at a rapid rate despite the increase in airfares and gasoline.

So the rumor circulating at The Orleans was that in some fashion the 2009 USBC Open tournament will be able to handle more teams than expected. I don't know how they are going to do it, but if the rumor is true then the USBC would have to do one of four things:

1. Begin the USBC Open before the announced Feb. 8-15 starting dates set aside for the Masters on national TV.

2. Extend the tournament after the World Women's tournament, which was scheduled to be the closing event.

3. Start squads earlier and end later each day to accommodate more teams.

4. Add a few lanes to the 56 that already have been announced.

Knowing what I know about most convention center schedules that are set in stone, I think there is little chance to start at earlier date or end later than previously announced.

Ditto for changing squad schedules.

So, if the rumors are true -- and I hope they are since that would be a big boost for the USBC Open and the bowling industry itself -- then I would guess they will add a few more lanes.

And here is a tip for any bowlers headed for Las Vegas in the next 12 months -- go on the Internet and look for deals on rooms Sunday through Thursday.

The rumor is that bowlers who are slot club members at certain hotels are getting a lower rate than in previous years.

I know that as a slot-card member at The Orleans, I received some room rate offers through the mail as low as \$30 during certain Sunday-through-Thursday periods. It won't hold true if a giant convention is in Las Vegas, but it is definitely a possibility since Las Vegas is catering to bowlers these lean days.

It was encouraging to note that the NABI paid its National champion \$40,000 instead of the advertised \$25,000 so you know participation had to be high.

One final note -- don't forget I may have been listening to bad rumors.

PBA Part of the Deal

Somebody sent me a series of notes released by the Bowling Proprietors Association of America and the following one caught my attention:

"The U.S. Women's Open, a BPAA event licensed to the USBC, will return this fall with five consecutive weeks of telecasts on ESPN, showcasing the world's best known women bowlers on national television for the second consecutive season.

"The event will take place July 31-Aug. 6 in the Chicago suburb of Romeoville, Ill., at Brunswick Zone XL. All five telecasts will be taped Aug. 5-6 and will air for five consecutive weeks beginning on Sunday Sept. 7 at 1 p.m. Eastern."

All the above information is accurate but the note fails to point out that the five taped telecasts also will determine the bowlers who will bowl in seven PBA tournaments -- Oct. 29-Nov. 2 in Omaha, Nov. 9-16 in Taylor, Mich.; Vernon Hills, Ill., Nov. 26-30; Dec. 3-7 in Cheektowaga, N.Y.; Dec. 10-14 in Baltimore, Jan. 4-11 in Reno and Jan. 14-18 in Medford, Ore..

I flew out to Reno for the U.S. Women's Open competition and TV taping so I know first hand that most of the contestants in the U.S. Women's Open will come up with the extra money to try to qualify for the PBA berths and a chance to bowl for a national PBA title on a live ESPN telecast. I wouldn't be surprised if Commissioner/CEO Fred Schreyer won't be able to figure out a way to get the top gal in the PBA series a berth in the Tournament of Champions Jan. 19-25 in Las Vegas. The girls proved a big hit in four PBA tournaments last season so that is why the PBA added three additional events during the 2008-09 season. Bowling can do big things when all organizations participate.

\$3 Million Amateur

Imagine my surprise when I read a profile sheet put out by Storm about Jason Belmonte, the veteran amateur bowler with the unorthodox two-hand delivery. First I was surprised to learn that his favorite athlete is tennis whiz Roger Federer until I noted that Belmonte also likes golf, squash and tennis. I knew that Belmonte was one of the world's great amateur bowlers but imagine my surprise when I learned that he has earned \$3,040,948. TIME TO UPGRADE YOUR YOUTH PROGRAM

I think it is time we took a page from many of the other sports that are vying for increased youth participation. Does soccer ring a bell? It is only one of several youth sports that have had a huge impact on our declining numbers of youth league bowlers.

A key influence determining what sport a child takes up can be found in his or her parent(s). Parents look for many things in a youth program, some of which are:

- What is the cost (participation fee, travel to and from venue, uniform, equipment)?
- How convenient is it to the families existing scheduled activities?
- Will their child get an opportunity to play?
- Will it be fun?
- Competition level...introductory, recreation based, varsity club or team, select or elite?
- Social and self-esteem growth opportunities.
- Skill development.
- Coaching support
- Scholarship opportunities.

Skill development in bowling is a key component and is easy to monitor with each weekly standing sheet. Improvement in skill is also tied in closely with other factors that may influence the parent and are included on the list above.

I am from the Pacific Northwest, and yes, we do get a fair amount of rain. We also have many bodies of water surrounding our cities and towns. Therefore, nearly every Northwest area parent enrolls their children in swim classes. When my daughter was about three we took her to the local pool for swimming lessons.

On the final day of the six week session I went to pick her up and she came over to me dripping wet and smiling. She held out something in her hand that she wanted me to see. I took it from her and there it was, her 'report card' for the past six weeks of swim lessons. And, to my great delight (and hers as well) according to this report, she was now a full fledged 'polliwog'. Wow! How cool was that?

On the paper there were several 'skills' that my daughter had mastered during her time in the pool. Things like BLOWING BUBBLES (she got two checks for that skill), HOLDING HER BREATH FOR FIVE SECONDS, JUMPING IN ON HER OWN, etc. She was very proud and so were her mother and I.

New Coaches Hall of Fame Committee Gets It Right

The greatest honor that can be bestowed on any athlete is induction into a Hall of Fame. Virtually every sport honors its elite athletes baseball, football, basketball, golf, tennis, and other sports, including bowling.

Bowling's greatest honor is induction into the USBC Hall of Fame. Bowling not only bestows this honor in the performance category but also reserves a place in the Meritorious Service category for those who have contributed in special ways to make the game better.

And now, by virtue of the incredible leadership of John Bergland, the Bowling Proprietors Association of America, through the work of Strike Ten Entertainment and new Skill's Center, a newly formed Bowling Coaches Hall of Fame Committee has created a hall of fame for coaches who have made a significant impact on the game.

During the past eight or 10 years, bowling has stressed the importance of coaching and instruction to elevate the game to higher standards. From tots to teens, from grade school to high schools and well into colleges, coaching programs and seminars have increased steadily. Gold, Silver, and Bronze level coaches have sprung up all over the country. Additionally, training centers, led by the Kegel Company hire the BEST instructors in the world and stay busy year around. Many other bowling seminars are being conducted such as Bowling This Month's Super School and Dick Ritger Bowling Camps. Susie Minchew, Fred Borden, Mark Baker, and other top rated coaches hold periodical seminars for bowlers who are eager to improve.

The first-ever 2008 inductee to the Bowling Coaches Hall of Fame is Dick Ritger who, in my estimation, was, and is, the most worthy selection among the greatest instructors the game has ever seen. Prior to his creation of the Dick Ritger Bowling Academy, Ritger was selected as one of the Top Twenty Bowlers of the 20th Century. He won 20 PBA titles and retired from the PBA tour while still capable of adding to his titles credit He embarked on a coaching career that covered 24 countries on five continents.

Dick Ritger is truly bowling's World Ambassador. He is, unquestionably, the most influential person to have spread the bowling gospel throughout the world. He pioneered and paved the way for numerous coaches who now practice their craft all over the bowling universe.

Ritger shares his induction with a group of nine Trailblazers, also selected by the Hall of Fame Committee., trailblazers who were recognized as bowling visionaries who laid the foundation for all who followed. This list includes:



Lou Bellissimo, the first renown college bowling coach.

Buddy Bomar, one of bowling's earliest prominent instructors, conducting bowling clinics nationwide.

Bill Bunetta, known for teaching coaches how to coach.

Frank Clause, the bowling professor, who authored books and instructional films for AMF

Ned Day, one of the first to make extensive exhibition tours

Chief Halftown, known as the "father of in-school bowling"

"Doc" Hattstrum, first to analyze some of the sport's core principals.

Floretta Mc Cutcheon, thd first known woman bowling coach

Andy Varipapa, the first to make bowling movies and used them for instruction.

The Hall of Fame Committee must be commended for their recognition of all these great pioneers of the game. Their rewards have been LONG OVERDUE.

I feel certain that many of today's top coaches will eventually be inducted to the Bowling Coaches Hall of Fame, particularly considering all the new measures being utilized. These new innovations include the CATS machine, Bowlers Map, and cameras that record every facet of bowling execution. Unfortunately for today's new crop of coaches and instructors, longevity and results are of the utmost importance. It will take time. Nevertheless, three or four names are a DEFINITE MUST for consideration to the coaches sanctuary. No Coaches Hall of Fame can ever be completely fulfilled without the addition of such coaches as Tom Kouros, Bill Taylor, and Fred Borden.

Tom Kouros penned the greatest selling instructional book ever, Par Bowling. He also aided many professional bowlers as well as countless amateurs. He coached throughout the world and was honored by the World Bowling Writers when they instituted the Tom Kouros Outstanding International Coach Award. Kouros is a current instructional writer for the International Bowlers Journal.

Bill Taylor was an extraordinary coach, an innovator in measuring bowling devises, and wrote some of the greatest manuals in the game, including drilling procedures and Target Lines, a book depicting various methods for attacking lanes. His "parallel lines" concepts are still the prime methods of execution in professional ranks.

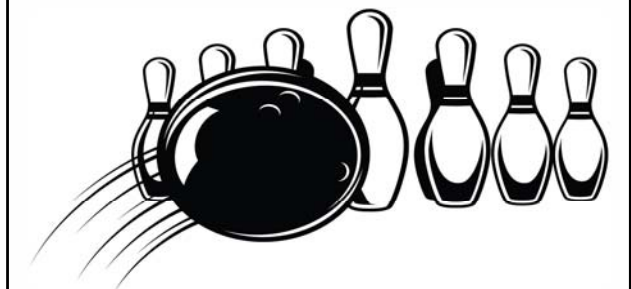
Fred Borden is partially responsible for the current growth of bowling coaches. Prior to his being named Team USA coach, Borden wrote several bowling books and worked with a number of professional bowlers. He was very instrumental in the career of Don Johnson and several other top professional players. He penned the first manuals for Gold, Silver, and Bronze Level coaches and has been a stalwart in recruiting new blood for the USBC coaching program.

I feel certain Kouros, Taylor, and Borden will be recognized by the Bowling Coaches Hall of Fame Committee.

Some people think I belong to this elite group. My bosom buddy, Dick Evans, spoke to me about his original story this year that inspired John Berglund, Executive-Secretary of thre BPAA to form a Coaches Committee.
