Johnson Wins Women's Singles Gold at Pan American Games

GUADALAJARA, Mexico - Liz Johnson of Cheektowaga, N.Y., won the women's singles giving Team USA three gold medals in four events in bowling at the 2011 Pan American Games.

Johnson defeated Jennifer Park of Canada, 2-0, to earn the gold at Bolerama Tapatio. Chris Barnes of Double Oak, Texas, took the silver medal in men's singles, falling in the championship match 2-0 to Santiago Mejia of Colombia.

"Anytime you win three out of four gold medals you can't say anything but that it was successful," Team USA head coach Rod Ross said. "We had a shot at getting all four, but Colombia bowled extremely well and deserved to earn the gold."

Johnson had little trouble in the gold-medal match, taking down Park 232-196 and 235-190 in the best-of-three format.

"It was a tough battle but it feels great to come out on top," Johnson said. "There were some great players in this field. Physically I felt really good, and I used a few tricks in my bag to do what I had to do to strike."

Barnes, meanwhile, was never able to get on track in his match against Mejia, losing 189-171 and 205-193.

"Of course it is disappointing not to win the gold, but I just didn't perform very well," Barnes said. "The left lane was tricky, and I wasn't able to put any pressure on him. He bowled very well and kept all the pressure on me."

In the semifinals, Barnes advanced with a 2-1 victory over Manuel Fernandez of the Dominican Republic, while Mejia defeated Marcelo Suartz of Brazil, 2-1. Johnson knocked off Karen Marcano of Venezuela, 2-0, and Park defeated Canadian teammate Caroline Lagrange, 2-1. The semifinal losers shared the bronze medal.

Team USA's Bill O'Neill of Southampton, Pa., lost in the quarterfinals to Mejia, 711-589 in the three games, total pinfall match. Kelly Kulick of Union, N.J., fell in the opening round to Brazil's Stephanie Martins, 630-587.

The United States started the Pan American Games by sweeping the men's and women's doubles gold medals. Since bowling became a medal sport in 1991, Team USA has earned 20 of a possible 28 gold medals in bowling at the Pan American Games.

Held every four years, the Pan American Games are the second-largest multi-sport event after the Olympic Games. This year, nearly 6,000 athletes from the American Zone are competing in 36 sports.

Team USA Sweeps Doubles Gold Medals at Pan American Games

The United States swept the doubles gold medals Tuesday in the opening event of bowling at the 2011 Pan American Games.

Chris Barnes of Double Oak, Texas, and Bill O'Neill of Southampton, Pa., topped the men's field by 193 pins, while Liz Johnson of Cheektowaga, N.Y., and Kelly Kulick of Union, N.J., easily won the women's event by 328 pins at Bolerama Tapatio.

"They fought and ground it out from the first ball of the first game," Team USA head coach Rod Ross said. "Even though the margin of victory may appear large, it was a difficult victory. This is a very strong field with some very talented bowlers."

Barnes and O'Neill finished with a 12-game total of 5,211 to claim the victory. Barnes led the way with 2,698 (224.8 average), while O'Neill shot 2,513 (209.4 average). Venezuela took the silver with 5,018, while Colombia earned bronze with 4,856.

The American men got off to a hot start in the first game Tuesday, opening with a score of 515 to give them some breathing room.

"Even though as a team I don't think we had our best performance of the year, in the end we bowled well when we needed to," Barnes said. "By getting off to the solid start, it gave us a big lead. But we may have gotten just a little too relaxed and into a holding pattern and didn't bowl great down the stretch."

O'Neill was disappointed in his individual performance Tuesday after bowling games of 149 and 166 in the six-game block, but said he was fortunate Barnes was able to get lined up and throw strikes. "It's a great feeling to win the gold medal, but part of me wishes I could have done more to help Chris out," O'Neill said. "This was one of my worst performances in a long time, but luckily my teammate was there to pick me up and carry us to the gold."

Kulick and Johnson led the women's doubles from the first game Monday and never looked back. Their lead was never less than 250 pins on Tuesday, and they finished with a 12-game total of 5,257. Mexico took the silver medal with 4,929, while Colombia earned bronze with 4,851.

Johnson led the pair with 2,633 (219.4 average), while Kulick finished with 2,624 (218.7 average). "Just to be recognized with the Olympic sports here at the Pan American Games is a great feeling," Kulick said. "Any U.S. athlete who walks around with a gold medal around their neck is respected, and that's a really nice feeling."

Over the course of the 12 games, the Team USA women never threw a game under 190. Johnson said staying consistent and filling frames helped propel them to the victory.

Aw Shucks!

Thanks to Greg Stock we can now all shuck our fresh ears of corn easily and instantly.

Put two ears of corn in the microwave for four minutes. Wear protective gloves and cut off the end where the ear is cut from the stalk. Hold the cob by the end with the silk coming out of it and shake it. Be sure to catch the corn with your other hand. It will come out clean and ready to use. This is the best way I have ever seen to clean the silk off of fresh corn—it makes eating fresh corn fun again! Thanks Greg.



Cowboy Cookies to Give and Enjoy

- Gather:
- 6 cups rolled oats
 - 4 cups all-purpose flour
 - 3 cups packed brown sugar
 - 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
 - 2 teaspoons baking powder
 - 1 teaspoon baking soda
 - 1 1/2 teaspoons salt
 - 1 pound shortening
 - 2 cups raisins
 - 1 1/2 cups shredded coconut
 - 1 cup semisweet chocolate chips
 - 1 cup chopped pecans

In a large bowl combine oats, flour, brown sugar, cinnamon, baking powder, baking soda and salt. With a pastry blender cut in shortening until crumbly. Stir in raisins, coconut, chocolate chips and pecans.

Refrigerate in an airtight container for up to 10 weeks. Attach a tag that reads: Preheat the oven to 375 degrees F. Grease a baking sheet, or line with parchment paper. Measure 4 cups of the mix into a large bowl. Whisk together 1 egg, 2 tablespoons milk and 2 teaspoons vanilla; stir into the mix. Roll into 1-1/2 inch balls and place on prepared baking sheet. Flatten with a fork dipped in sugar. Bake in preheated oven for 15 to 18 minutes, or until golden. Allow cookies to cool on baking sheet for 5 minutes before removing to a wire rack to cool completely.

Makes 10 dozen cookies! Yum, yum!!!!

Idle Bowling Thoughts

... A team's lineup positions can be very important. All-time great Parker Bohn III feels that your leadoff individual should be a deadly spare shooter, one that can mark when it counts most and one that can spark the spirit of a team. The anchor, or final bowler in the lineup should be your best all-around bowler, but not necessarily the one with the highest average. A top anchor can hit the pocket when the pressure is on, is a good solid spare bowler, but one better known for coming up with hat strike or two when needed in a tight game.

... There is no such thing as an easy spare, unless it's the one you don't have to face because you got a strike.

... Did you know that up until 1994, from 1958, pro bowlers had to follow strict limits on the length of hair, pony tails, braids and beards.

... In the more than 50 years that pro bowling has been on TV, the happening causing the most comment was not a big win, not a particular match, not a perfect game, but Mark Roth's first ever TV conversion of the 7-10 split.

... You hear about the 300 games rolled in bowling. But a real rarity in bowling is a 291 game, and the arrest of them all in the upper category is a 292 game.

... Bowling does have some power to make people much more attentive to dates. The same people who make medical and business matter appointments mere days in advance often enter bowling tournaments two years prior to the competition.

... The move to Texas by most integers in bowling will take time, particularly such attractions as the International Bowling Hall of Fame and Museum, but it has to be one of the most forward thinking bowling ideas in the history of the sport.

... The more you study bowling history the more you realize that the negative of bowling has been expanded and repeated much more than the more prevalent positives in the sport—at every level.

... Many long years ago John Petraglia was asked who he saw as the future stars. His selections were Parker Bohn III, Dave Ozio, Amleto Monacelli, Pete Weber, Brian Voss and Del Ballard. That's what you call a super crystal ball. All became top stars and all have been elected into the PBA Hall of Fame.

... The good old days were when you were pretty sure you could bowl your weight.

... When you discuss smooth bowlers the name of the late Joe Joseph comes to mind most often. For a fairly big man, he moved to the line with all the grace and balance of dancing legend Fred Astaire. One big difference, Joseph carried a heavy ball, not a light hat or cane.

... The head pin of a bowling setup probably has more strange marks directed to it than any other inanimate object in the world.

... Any league secretary or tournament director will tell you that the people who know all the bowling rules and let you know they do are not nearly as bad as the bowlers who think they know all the rules.



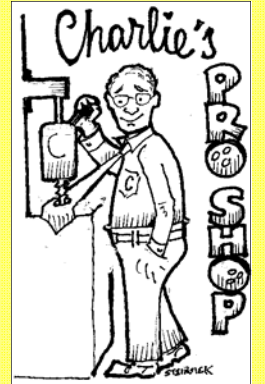

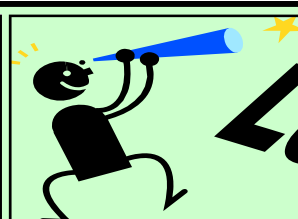

Fred Schreyer Retires as PBA CEO, Commissioner



Fred Schreyer, Chief Executive Officer and Commissioner of the Professional Bowlers Association, today announced his retirement after 11 years of service to the organization. The PBA Board of Directors has named Geoff Reiss Chief Executive Officer and has promoted Tom Clark to the position of Commissioner, effective November 1.

Schreyer will continue to serve the PBA as a senior advisor.

"Fred has managed the PBA through a really challenging period. We're grateful for his leadership and that he's agreed to continue working with us to grow the PBA," said Mike

Slade of the PBA ownership group.

Schreyer joined the PBA full-time in October 2002 as Chief Operating Officer and General Counsel, and was named Commissioner in 2003. But he has been affiliated with the organization since 2000 as its legal counsel. The University of Michigan and UCLA Law School graduate has 25 years of experience in the sports industry, including a seven-year stint as Director of Sports Marketing at Nike and was a founder of Nike's Sports Management division.

Among Schreyer's signature accomplishments during his tenure at the PBA's helm were negotiation of umbrella sponsorship packages with Denny's and Lumber Liquidators, opening PBA membership to women for the first time (2004), creation of the PBA Summer Series, creation of the PBA World Series of Bowling, production of the PBA's 50th Anniversary Gala in 2009 and working to allow PBA members to represent their country as Team USA members.

"Serving the PBA for the past 11 years has been a great privilege and a tremendous experience," Schreyer said. "It is always difficult to step back, but I feel good about handing the reins to Geoff and Tom. As the PBA embarks upon its 53rd year, I look forward to continuing to provide assistance wherever I am needed."

Reiss, who joined the PBA as Vice Chairman in March 2011, previously held several positions at ESPN, was CEO at Associated Content, and was Senior Vice President/General Manager of Newsweek's digital division. While at ESPN, Reiss managed the launch of ESPN.com, NFL.com, NBA.com, and NASCAR Online. He also was Senior Vice President/General Manager of ESPN the Magazine, and managed ESPN's relationships with Electronic Arts, Microsoft, and The Tribeca Film Festival. He developed and acquired the Peabody Award-winning Dan Klores documentary Black Magic. He started his media career at Spy magazine.

"The PBA has a terrific opportunity to establish an important presence in the sports marketplace and I'm looking forward to working with our team, members and industry partners to fully realize our potential," said Reiss.

Clark became the PBA's Vice President and COO in March 2008 after serving as the Vice President of Marketing and Communications for the United States Bowling Congress. Clark, who was promoted to Deputy Commissioner in 2009, came to USBC from USA Today where he worked as a sports editor from 2000-2005. Previously he was an executive editor and sports editor for newspapers in the Media General chain and founded and published a sports magazine in his hometown Syracuse, N.Y.

The former collegiate bowler was named Bowlers Journal International magazine's "Person of the Year" in the bowling industry for 2005 for his efforts in bringing publicity to the game. Clark also was the recipient of the 2008 Billiard and Bowling Institute of America Industry Service Award and the 2009 USBC Joyce Deitch Trailblazer Award.

"It's an honor to be given this opportunity to help build an organization that has meant so much to my life," Clark said. "I love the sport of bowling and the PBA and I'm energized by that same passion for the game that our players and fans have shown for over 50 years."

The PBA also has announced that Kirk Von Krueger, Vice President and Director of PBA Tours, has been promoted to Deputy Commissioner. Von Krueger, a former PBA touring player, began his career with the PBA in 1995 as assistant Tournament Director, becoming Tournament Director in 1996.

Dino Castillo Wins Third PBA Regional Title in Richardson

Richardson, Texas, (October 23, 2011) – Dino Castillo of Carrollton, Texas, won only six of his 12 matches, but that was enough to hold off amateur Erik Vermilyea, from Mansfield, Texas, and allow Castillo to claim his third PBA Regional title in the PBA Southwest Region Dallas Open, presented by Dallas Orthopaedic Trauma Surgeons, at AMF Richardson Lanes Sunday.



Castillo and Vermilyea battled for the lead throughout the match play portion of the event as they pulled away from the other finalists. Castillo sealed the tournament victory with a 204-165 win over Vermilyea in the final position

round match. Castillo ended with a 25-game total of 5,753 pins, including match game bonus pins.

Lonnie Waliczek, Wichita, Kansas, edged Mike Austin from Magnolia, Texas for third place.

SMART Corporation Revises Scholarship Use Policy

SMART Bowling Scholarship Funding Corporation is revising its scholarship use policy to better protect student-athlete eligibility and ensure compliance with collegiate and state high school athletic associations' regulations.

Effective November 1, 2011, SMART scholarship funds may only be used for qualifying secondary education expenses. All funds disbursement, after final review and approval, will be paid directly to the educational institution. No policy exceptions for direct reimbursement of SMART funds to a student or parent will be allowed.

Qualifying expenses for SMART Scholarship funds include tuition/fees, textbooks, meal plans, housing plans, required class supplies and equipment necessary for the successful completion of a course or program at universities, colleges, business

schools, technical schools, trade schools or vocational schools.

"A primary mission of SMART is to protect the eligibility of student-athletes," SMART Corporation Board Chairman Wally Hall said. "To protect their eligibility, SMART's policies must guarantee that scholarship funds are applied solely for secondary education and prevent any use of money that could be considered a cash prize or improper benefit."

Under the new policy, SMART scholarship funds may not be used for sport equipment or supplies; bowling and non-bowling sport camp, clinic or lessons; private tutors' fees; elementary or high school tuition/fees; costs related to computer repair; normal school supplies; transportation expenses (including parking permits); or clothing expenses.

A fully revised SMART policy manual is being developed and is scheduled to be finalized next year.

Two Women's Events Added to 2012 World Bowling Tour

For the first time, two women's only events have been added to the schedule for the World Tenpin Bowling Association World Bowling Tour. Bowling's U.S. Women's Open and the United States Bowling Congress Queens are two of the biggest women's only events in the world and the additions bring the World Bowling Tour schedule to 14 events for 2012.

"These are two major events for women bowlers, so it's only natural that they would want to be a part of the World Bowling Tour," WTBA President Kevin Dornberger said. "The growth of the World Bowling Tour has simply been incredible, and this is very positive for the sport on an international level."

The USBC Queens is scheduled for April 19-24 in Euless, Texas, at AMF Euless Lanes, which was the site of the 2011 U.S. Women's Open. The Queens is expected to feature a prize fund of nearly \$125,000.

"We are proud to add the USBC Queens - one of the most prestigious women's events in the world - to the 2012 World Bowling Tour," USBC Executive Director Stu Upson said. "International participants have a history of doing well in this event, and we look forward to even more international participation moving forward."

The U.S. Women's Open will take place in Reno, Nevada, at the National Bowling Stadium from June 21-27. The finals will take place on specially constructed lanes beneath the famous Reno Arch in downtown Reno.

"As one of the premier female bowling events in the world it was only natural that Bowling's U.S. Women's Open be listed on the schedule," Bowling Proprietors' Association of America Executive Director Steve Johnson said. "We are truly pleased to be included as last year we had 17 countries represented and expect even more this year."

The 2011 World Bowling Tour wraps up this week with the AMF Australian Masters, which ends October 22. Upon completion of that event, the top three men and three women in the World Bowling Tour rankings will be announced. Those players will take part in the World Bowling Tour Finals presented by the Professional Bowlers Association on November 17 in Las Vegas.

The World Tenpin Bowling Association, which is made up of 115 bowling federations, governs the sport throughout the world. For more information on WTBA and the World Bowling Tour, visit World-TenpinBowling.com.
